

Dr Nkosazana Clarice Dlamini Zuma was appointed as Minister responsible for Women, Youth, and Persons with Disabilities on 6 March 2023 in South Africa. She served as Minister for Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs from 30 May 2019 to 6 March 2023 and Minister of The Presidency from 27 February 2018 to 25 May 2019. Dr Dlamini Zuma was elected as the first woman to lead the African Union Commission on 15 July 2012 and served until 30 January 2017.

A leader who has implemented transformative policies to advance education in Africa. This award acknowledges visionary leadership in improving access, quality and inclusivity in education, shaping the future of African youth.

### 2025 award-winners

# Herman Chinery-Hesse

Herman Chinery–Hesse, a pioneer in the field of technology in Africa, was recognised globally for his innovation in software and fintech. Listed among Foreign Policy's Top 100 Global Thinkers, he earned accolades including a GUBA Award, Ghana's Millennium Excellence Award for IT and a Mobile World Lifetime Achievement Award. In 1991, he co-founded the SOFT tribe Ltd, one of Africa's earliest and premier software firms, delivering indigenous technology solutions to multinational companies and institutions such as the United Nations and Mastercard Foundation. His fintech innovations, including the "Sundiata" payment system, helped shape Africa's digital economy.

A sought-after speaker at Oxford, Harvard and TED, he was profiled by CNN, Forbes and the Financial Times. He also launched Afrikan Echoes, an audiobook platform for African stories. Before his death in September 2024, Google named a meeting room in his honour. An alumnus of Texas State University, he inspired generations of African tech innovators and was hailed as an African technology folk hero.





# Ms Bridgette Motsepe-Radebe

Ms Bridgette Motsepe-Radebe, a pioneering South African mining entrepreneur, defied apartheid-era laws to become the country's first black female mine owner. Born into an entrepreneurial family, she was denied entry to one of South Africa's premier universities to study law because of guidelines on racial segregation, but persevered to establish Mmakau Mining, which holds stakes in platinum, coal and chrome. She played an important role in shaping South Africa's mining legislation and championing empowerment models across Africa.

As President of the South African Mining Development Association, she influenced key mining policies and led initiatives to alleviate poverty in mining communities. She serves on the BRICS Business Council, chairs the Black Business Council and has held critical government advisory roles. Recognised globally, she received the 2008 International Businessperson of the Year award and was named one of Forbes's 20 Most Powerful Women in Africa. Honoured by the African Union and the Andrew Young Foundation, she remains a transformative force in Africa's economic landscape.

### Dr Rakesh Wahi

Dr Rakesh Wahi is a visionary entrepreneur with over 35 years' experience in early-stage investment across emerging markets. As the Chairman of CMA Investment Holdings, he oversees operations in 15 countries. He co-founded and chairs the ABN Group, which includes CNBC Africa and Forbes Africa, and leads Transnational Academic Group, which runs Curtin University Dubai and Lancaster University Ghana.

A former officer in the Indian Army Corps of Engineers, he received the Vishisht Seva Medal in 1985 and helped establish India's second Antarctic base. He has championed education and capacity-building in Africa, founding the ABN Education Trust and TAG Foundation to support disadvantaged students. He is also an avid mountaineer and philanthropist and has been honoured by multiple stock exchanges. His memoir, Be a Lion, was published in 2016. A graduate of Jawaharlal Nehru University, he was awarded an honourary doctorate in Namibia for his contribution to education and business.





### **Mesfin Tasew**

Mesfin Tasew was appointed Group CEO of Ethiopian Airlines in March 2022, bringing nearly four decades of experience in aviation to the role. He joined the airline in 1984 as an associate engineer and rose steadily through the ranks, serving in key technical and managerial roles. In 1999, he became Chief Information Officer, later holding positions as Vice-President of Maintenance and Engineering (2006) and Chief Operating Officer (2010–2021).

Before taking the helm at Ethiopian Airlines, he was CEO of ASKY Airlines from 2021 to 2022. He also serves on the Board of Governors of the International Air Transport Association (IATA). Mesfin holds a BSc and MSc in electrical engineering from Addis Ababa University and an MBA from the Open University in the UK. His leadership has been instrumental to the global expansion of Ethiopian Airlines, reinforcing its position as Africa's leading carrier.

### Dr Sidi Ould Tah

Dr Sidi Ould Tah was elected President of the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA) in 2015, assuming office on 1 July. A former Minister of Economy and Finance in Mauritania (2008–2015), he previously advised both the Mauritanian President and Prime Minister and played critical roles in national economic policy, including chairing the National Statistics Council and serving as a board member of the Central Bank.

He represented Mauritania at major financial institutions, including the World Bank, the African Development Bank and the Islamic Development Bank. Holder of a PhD in economics from the University of Nice-Sophia-Antipolis, he has completed executive courses at Harvard, London Business School and the Swiss Finance Institute. Fluent in Arabic, French and English, he has received several prestigious honours, including Mauritania's Knight Medal of National Merit and Senegal's National Order of the Lion. His leadership continues to shape economic development across Africa.





# Wode Maya

Wode Maya (born Berthold Kobby Winkler Ackon) is a Ghanaian content creator and digital influencer reshaping global perceptions of Africa. With over 1.5 million YouTube subscribers, he spotlights African innovation, entrepreneurship and culture, challenging negative stereotypes and offering an authentic narrative of the continent. What started as a personal mission to present a more uplifting view of Africa has evolved into a movement bridging the diaspora and inspiring young Africans to embrace their heritage. Beyond storytelling, Wode Maya collaborates with entrepreneurs, governments and grass-roots movements to amplify Africa's successes. His work extends to sustainable development, youth empowerment and cross-border initiatives, positioning him as a leading voice in Africa's digital transformation.

### Dr Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma

Dr Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma was born in Natal Province on 27 January 1949 and is a distinguished anti-apartheid activist, medical doctor, politician and diplomat. She has served in every post-apartheid South African cabinet since 1994, holding key portfolios including Health under Nelson Mandela, Foreign Affairs under Thabo Mbeki and Kgalema Motlanthe, and Home Affairs under Jacob Zuma. Under Cyril Ramaphosa, she has led multiple ministries, most recently Cooperative Governance during the COVID-19 pandemic.

From 2012 to 2017, she served as the first female Chairperson of the African Union Commission, where she spearheaded Agenda 2063, Africa's long-term socio-economic transformation strategy. A lifelong champion of Pan-Africanism, gender equality and integration, she continues to shape Africa's future as the Chancellor of the University of Limpopo and Chair of APN's Advisory Council. She was honoured as the first Champion of the Africa We Want award-winner and her visionary leadership remains a beacon of the continent's development and unity.





## H.E. Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo

At the heart of his transformative agenda was the Free Senior High School (SHS) Policy, a groundbreaking initiative that has provided millions of Ghanaian children so far with access to secondary education, regardless of their financial background. The policy, introduced in 2017, has increased enrolment significantly, ensuring that no child is left behind because of economic constraints. By prioritising education as a catalyst for national development, President Akufo-Addo strengthened the foundation for a more skilled and empowered youth population.

Beyond access, his leadership championed curriculum modernisation, teacher training and infrastructure expansion. Ghana witnessed a renewed focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education, technical/vocational training and digital literacy — key areas that equip young people with the skills needed in a rapidly evolving alobal economy.

President Akufo-Addo's vision for education extended beyond Ghana's borders. A staunch advocate of Pan-African progress, he consistently championed education as a driver of economic transformation across Africa. His leadership aligned with the aspirations of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), emphasising the need for an educated workforce to fuel Africa's industrialisation and prosperity.

For his visionary leadership and dedication to educational transformation, H.E. Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo is recognised with the Transformational Leadership in Education Award at the Africa Prosperity Champions Awards. His impact on education, youth development and Africa's broader socio-economic advancement continues to inspire a new generation of leaders across the continent.


